1000 beautiful paper eggs will be hidden throughout the library. Redeem the paper eggs for chocolates! (maximum 10/child so there's enough for everyone!)




## **Holiday Hours**


We're delighted the library has been selected as one of 6 locations for this summer's roaming art installation - Pop Up Art Renfrew County.
