We have a great selection of non-fiction titles in our "Green Book" display on the main floor.

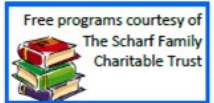


In the lower level our reader's advisory display features books so good they've reached the silver screen.

Easter is just around the corner and you're invited to our annual Easter Egg Hunt on Saturday March 31st.

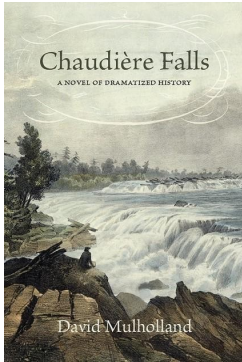
More than 1000 colourful paper eggs will be hidden throughout the library.
