

What is *InterLibrary Loan*? It is a platform connecting all Ontario Public Libraries to allow resource sharing. Smaller libraries with limited budgets for resources and/or physical space to house the materials are able to access items from libraries throughout the province.

In 2018, we brought in 937 books from other libraries for our patrons. Some for specific non-fiction subjects (research, health topics, history etc.), fiction (including demand for independent study or book clubs) or special collections such as audio materials and large print. That equates to \$23,400 in book purchases to fill those gaps. Last year, Amprior sent 1,817 materials to other libraries.


Two consecutive, successful Open Mics means we'll be hosting another—this time on a Saturday Night May 11 at 7pm. Doors open at 6:30.
