Summer is in full swing at the library and that means dozens of children will be coming to the library every day to attend our TD Summer Reading Club events, using their library cards to sign out materials, or just coming to relax in a cool spot while enjoying summer. More than 200 children sign up for the club. Each time they check out at least 5 items, they receive a TDSRC button to affix to their bags. Many of these avid library users are aiming for 10 visits to the library which will earn them an invitation to our end of summer party. Hats off to the parents, grandparents and sitters who help the children reach this goal!

This year the celebration features John Pert's Magic Show as well as a visit from the Ontario Falconry Centre. They'll be providing flight demonstrations and information about various types of falcons, hawks, eagles, owls and vultures. It's not everyday that people get to see a bird of prey up close and personal. This event includes a handson meet and greet, falconry facts, feedings and flight demos. The end of summer party is set for August 21st and is by invitation only.



There's still plenty of time to sign up for the TDSRC. Bring your child's library card to register. Take home a book bag, colouring markers and activity booklet. After that, you can sign up (online) for daily programming and start collecting those summer reading buttons! Our summer students, Gillian, Mary and Alex have got some fantastic programs lined up, each one featuring theme based read-alouds, songs, crafts, activities and a nutritious snack. All library programming is free thanks to the generosity of the Scharf Family Charitable Trust, The Arnprior Optimists, Arnprior Rotary and the Northern Credit Union.



The plan is to build five Little Lending Libraries for outlying areas of the community. Cash donations are now being accepted for building materials. Each Little Lending Library will be constructed of cedar with a cedar shingle roof and measure 18"x18". Depending on location, some will be wall mounted, others on a post. Tentative locations in the greater Arnprior McNab/ Braeside community include The White Lake General Store, Wes' Chips, Burnstown Beach (summer months) and more!

The Library will 'seed' the collections and provide ongoing inventory with the help of volunteers. If you'd like to become one of these volunteers, please fill out our online registration form.

If you'd like to contribute funds to help in the construction, please drop off your cash donation at the library or at the Seniors' Active Living Centre at 77B Madawaska Street. Charitable tax receipts are available.




